A one-year exploratory project to tackle key issues in medieval environmental, cultural and animal studies.

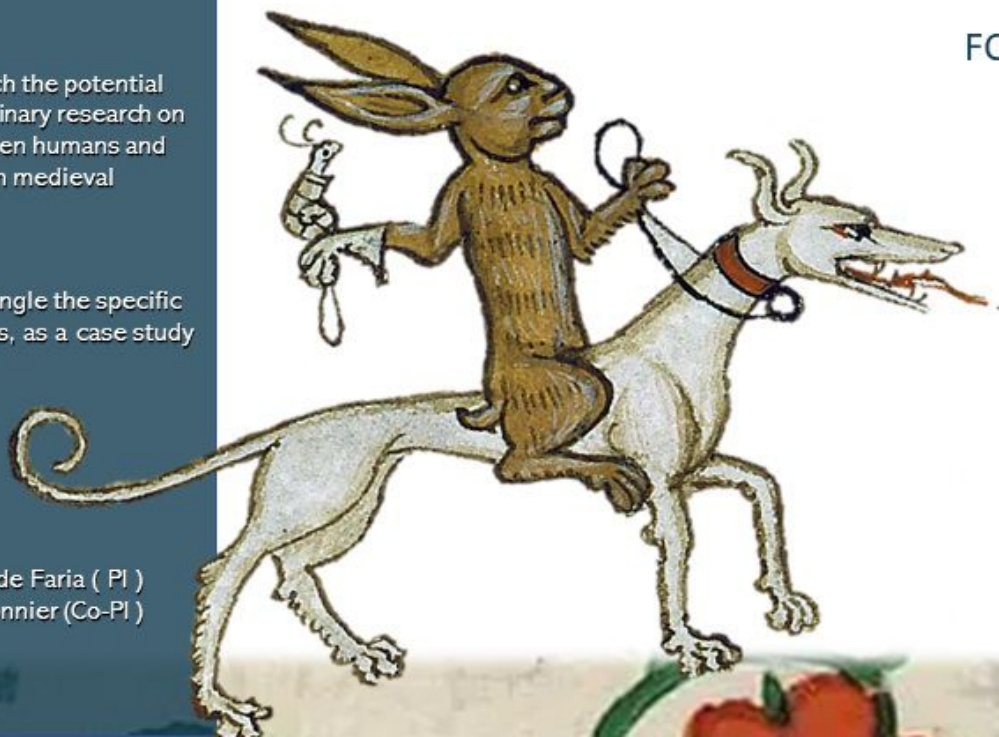
AIMS
